Every student is unique and has 'problems' to solve. With a focus on the visual arts, we will explore disability to extinguish old stereotypes, generate new awareness, and reveal diversified instruction for arts standards. Infused in such a way as to promote discussion and new insights, this hands-on workshop session offers both practical tips for adaptations to include all children as well as experiential activities for arts educators to expand classroom practices for successfully including students with diverse abilities.

Jeannine Chartier is a visual artist with a disability and has served as the Director of Very Special Arts of Rhode Island since 1996. Jeannine has more than 20 years experience in program design, development and evaluation of arts education, specializing in programs to be inclusive of persons with disabilities.

STRATEGIES FOR DIFFERENTIATING INSTRUCTION with Susan McGreevy-Nichols

Participants will gain an understanding of how to support the learning of students with disabilities in meeting content standards in dance and with using dance/movement as a way to access non-arts content. This hands-on workshop session will explore how the choreographic process can be used to spark student's imagination while providing a structure for student's success.

Susan McGreevy-Nichols is a nationally known dance educator and author of Building Dances, Building More Dances, Dance About Anything and Experiencing Dance. Susan will demonstrate how to use the arts as a way to differentiate instruction while effectively helping students meet dance content standards.
